Annual Activity Report

FY 2014-15

HELP (Human Effort for Love and Peace); a Kashmir based CSO incorporated in year 1997 by Mrs. Nighat Shafi. Since then, the foundation has been helping people in various fields with the help of donors, professionals, volunteers, trustees and philanthropists across the world. HELP established several schools across the valley and financially supported many others to provide quality education to children affected with the conflict in the state. HELP has been instrumental in uplifting the economically and socially weaker sections of the society with special focus on empowerment of women. Many other regular activities like awareness camps, training workshops, capacity building and mental health activities of the foundation have been effective in distressing the women and youth in the strife torn valley.

Glimpse of Major Activities over the year

Education:

HELP Foundation supported 560 orphans in their education by providing study material like books and stationary, financially supported 150 orphans so that they pay their tuition fees and transport charges to schools. A total amount of Rs. 16400/- per student was credited to the bank accounts of 236 students each during the year.

Direct assistance to flood affected Hr. Secondary school of Srinagar City: Lab equipments and books worth Rs. 2,50,000/- was provided to the school which benefited more than 1150 students during the year.



Occasional Assistance: More than 50 Orphans were paid Rs. 3000/- cash assistance each on occasions like Eid and "Ramadhan". Besides, 164 cases were dealt under CHILDLINE services in Srinagar District with the support from HELP Foundation.

Mental health:

Mariam Wellness Centre; run under the aegis of HELP Foundation was instrumental in extending mental health services to 2500 patients directly over the year. The centre is offering mental health services under the domains of Domestic violence, suicide prevention, drug addiction and other mental health related issues. After extending its support to various schools and



other institutions, the centre built the capacities of more than 300 teachers and trainers in detection of early symptoms of mental health issues among children and youth.

A series of awareness camps in mental health and general health issues like Cancer screening and diabetes etc. across valley has helped in detection of 89 cases with cancer and other severe disease symptoms.

Under the EEW initiative, HELP satisfactorily trained 1800 women during the year under various skill heads.

Since thousands of people were stranded in their respective residence without food and water we started rescue operations. The operation was limited



to our neighborhood as we were short of basic resources like boats, life jackets. However, our teams visited many areas and provided packaged food, water and medicine. In emergency case they moved people to safer places and hospitals in case it was needed.

Aid and Assistances:

During Financial year 2014-15, HELP foundation disbursed Rs. 4,55,000/- as occasional and timely assistance to poor patients and women headed families. HELP assisted a widow women entrepreneur in establishment of surgical goods manufacturing plant in Kashmir. Besides, help

sponsored several programmes highlighting social and legal issues with the women and children. HELP foundation organized many cultural programmes to boost the morale of local artists and celebrated International Women's Day and Disability day.

During last month of the year, HELP Foundation in collaboration with Handicap international floated a one year awareness programme for border areas like Rajuri, Punch, Baramulla and Kupwara. The Programme is about education people on Mine risk and risks associated with the remnants of war.

HELP Foundation also took up development work of public structures like Parks and gardens in the main city to develop the devastated city to its normal state.



Religious Programmes:

Some religious programmes are purely charity based and are performed during the holy month of Ramadhan by Muslims. HELP Foundation also participates in these programmes to reach out to the poor and needy during these periods.
